

TOMLINSON RECREATION CENTER ACTIVITIES



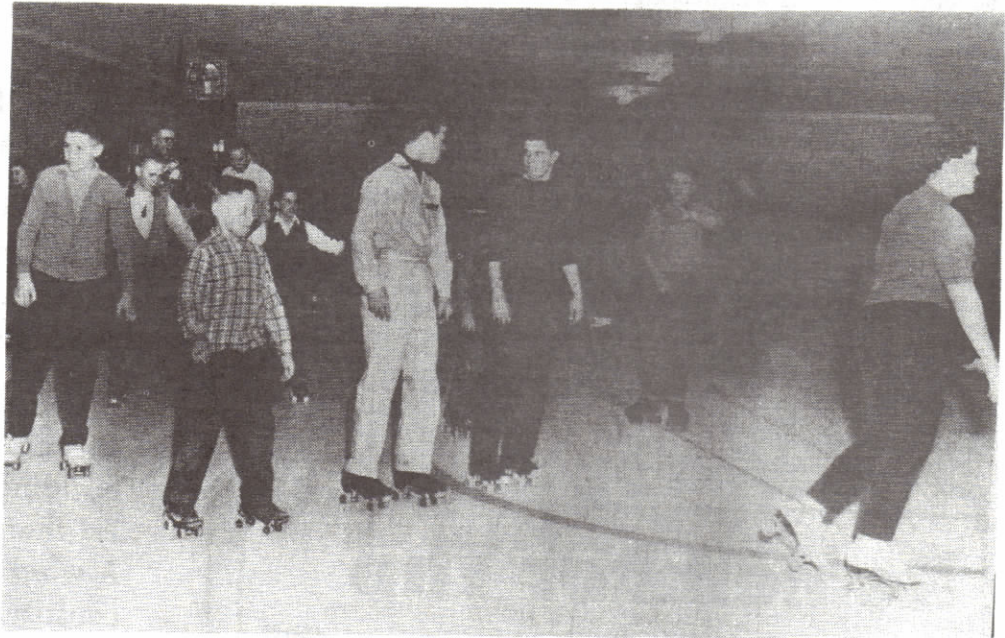

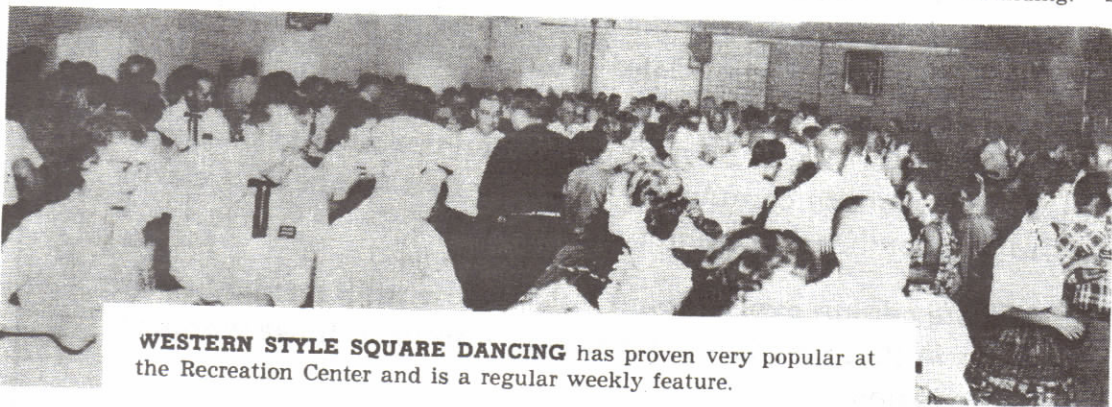

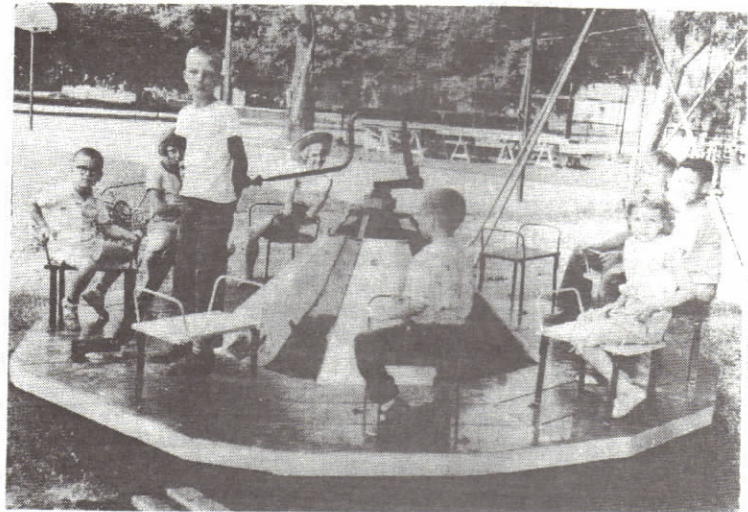
REFRESHMENT ROOM at the new Tomlinson Recreation building shows skaters taking a "breather" and some nourishment in the form of candy and pop.
