Since that time, they've played everywhere from the Hotel Orlando in Decatur, to a Fourth of July celebration at Herrick.

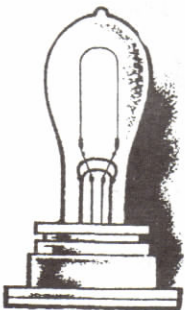
One Saturday they played a doubleheader, with appearances in New Berlin and Mechanicsburg. Often while traveling to
