**CHRISTMAS BOOKS WITH WORLD-WIDE THEME EXCELLENT**

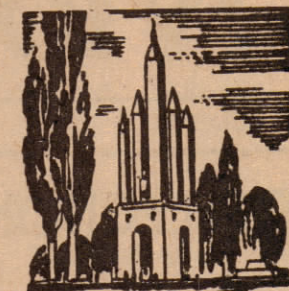

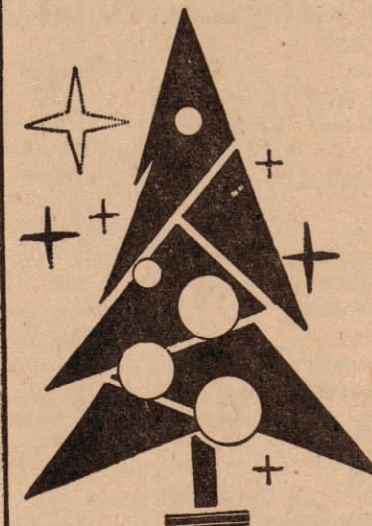
