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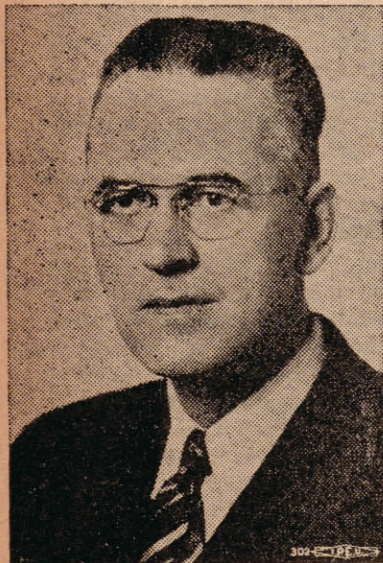


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Raymond Downs

Raymond Downs, Lincoln, the Republican candidate for Sheriff of Logan county, was born in 1898, on a farm in Missouri, where he was educated in the public schools.

He moved to Logan county in 1920 and engaged in farming in Eminence township and also engaged in farming and custom machine work in Prairie Creek township.

From 1924 to 1930, Mr. Downs was employed by the Atteberry Motor Co. in Atlanta. He moved to Lincoln in 1930 and was employed by the Langellier Motor Co., as salesman and as sales manager until 1939.

Mr. Downs has been a member of the Lincoln police force since 1939, and is now licensed by the Federal Communications Commission as a police radio operator.

Mr. Downs was married in 1927 to Miss Florence Liesman, of near Lawndale. They reside at 518 North Kickapoo street. Mr. Downs is a member of the Lincoln Elks lodge.
