Mrs. Anna Cain of Peru, Indiana, arrived Friday to visit her cousin, Ira Veail, and other relatives until after Thanksgiving.

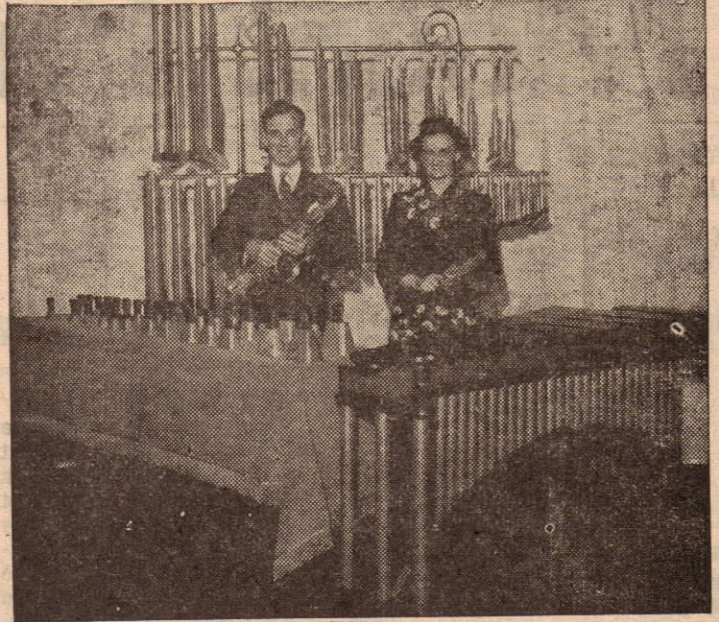
